Qualcomm Provides Financial Support to Parity for Disability

*— Supplies Vital Services, Information and Support for Children and Young Adults with
Disabilities —*

LONDON – January XX, 2011 – Qualcomm Incorporated (Nasdaq: QCOM), a leading developer and innovator of advanced wireless technologies, products and services, today announced that it has donated more than £29,262.89 (\$46,000) to Parity for Disability in Farnborough, UK. Parity is a local, independently registered charity, providing vital services, information and support to the affected children and young adults with profound and multiple disabilities, as well as their families and carers throughout Hampshire, Berkshire and Surrey. The money will go towards the running costs of Parity’s two day centres, one in Farnborough and the other in Camberley.

Parity, which began in 1953, receives some funding from local authorities to cover specialist staff costs, but is otherwise entirely reliant on external contributors to maintain the current level of services of its two day centres. The day centres provide educational programs to young adults (18-40) from the Hampshire, Surrey and Berkshire areas, and currently support 37 students. Every student who attends the day services receives one-on-one support and has an Individual

Programme Plan (IPP) detailing their individual goals in the areas of academic, social, living and recreational skills.

“Parity for Disability bridges the gap in services available to individuals with severe disability when they move away from the high level of support they receive in childhood to young adulthood, when the majority of that support disappears,” said John Caterer, managing director of Qualcomm UK. “We are pleased to be able to support the great work that Parity does and look forward to future collaboration.”

“Although we receive some government, funding we are almost entirely dependent on contributions to survive. Donations like this from Qualcomm are absolutely vital to the continued support and services we provide our students,” said Helen Pople, corporate fundraiser for Parity for Disability. “The individuals who use our day centres and other services have very significant physical disabilities and a learning need as most are unable to communicate using speech and need substantial support to express themselves. With the help of organisations like Qualcomm, we can continue to support our students to develop their independence and improve their quality of life as adults.”
